# Building on EXCELLENCE

## 2019 Started the Beginning of a New Era for Healthcare Delivery in Darke County and the Surrounding Area.

Wayne HealthCare broke ground on a \$56 million expansion project, which is the largest single healthcare investment in the hospital's history.

In May 2019, construction began on a 82,000-square-foot, three-story addition that will be anchored to the hospital, increasing its overall size to approximately 300,000 square feet. Wayne HealthCare's new addition will lead the way in modern healthcare infrastructure and amenities, including:

- New entry & public concourse linked directly to the existing lobby
- 32-bed private, acuity adjustable inpatient unit
- Special Beginnings Birthing Center
- Lifestyle Enhancement Wellness Center
- Expanded loading dock & materials management area

Construction is expected to be completed by late 2020 and the new addition is set to open to patients in January 2021. The project also includes renovations to 20,000 square feet of vacated spaces to accommodate imaging, cardiopulmonary and a stress lab.

### Groundbreaking Ceremony

A special community groundbreaking celebration was held on Tuesday, May 21st to officially kick-off the Wayne HealthCare facility expansion. Wayne Deschambeau, President and CEO, spoke about the hospital's history, details of the expansion plan and what this project will mean for the community in terms of providing access to world-class healthcare, close to home. Approximately 100 guests attended.



### Beam Signing Marks Construction Milestone

Wayne HealthCare invited the community to add their signature to a steel beam, which will help support the hospital's 82,000-square-foot addition. The beam was hoisted into place during a special topping-off ceremony, signifying the completion of the addition's steel framing.

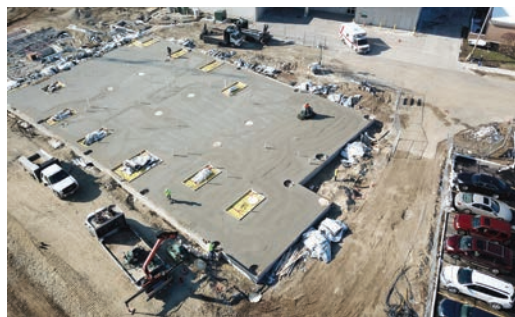

### Surgery Team Celebrates 100th Mako Surgery

In October 2019, the surgery team at Wayne HealthCare celebrated its 100th successful robotic-arm assisted surgery using the Stryker Mako robot. This highly advanced robotic technology is helping to revolutionize knee and hip replacement surgeries at Wayne HealthCare. The Mako's surgical precision ensures that each patient's joint replacement is customized to their specific anatomy, resulting in shorter hospital stays, quicker recoveries and higher patient satisfaction.



Wayne HealthCare is the only hospital in the region—encompassing Montgomery, Darke, Preble, Miami, and Mercer counties—that offers Mako robotic-assisted knee and hip surgeries.

## Vascular Screening Program

Each February, Wayne HealthCare provides discounted vascular screenings in celebration of "Pump Month." Events such as Heart Art featuring Drab to Fab and 4 Miles for Heart & Health assist with funds for the Vascular Screening Program. In 2019, 433 discounted preventative screenings were performed with a savings to the community of \$12,720. Overall the program has provided 1,154 discounted screenings with a community savings of \$30,874 since it began in 2016.

Heart Disease is the leading cause of death in the U.S. and in Darke County. These non-invasive vascular ultrasounds help our community keep a check on vascular health. The screenings can help identify risks that could lead to a future stroke or heart attack. On average 1 in 3 patients have a result that shows a need for follow-up care. The Foundation's goal is to change outcomes for the better and ultimately save lives. It's all about early detection and healthy hearts!

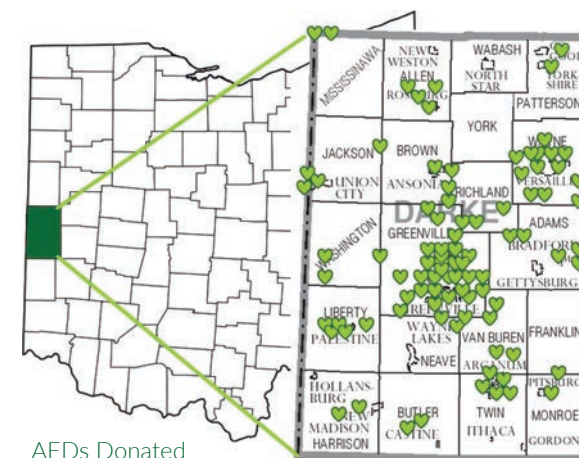

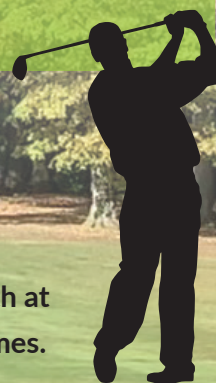
